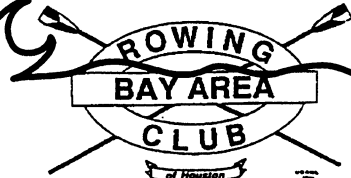

This is pretty much the same as the policy that has been in force under Chris.

I hope you have had the opportunity to row the quad with the hatchet blades. Concept II was generous enough to offer BARC a substantial discount on these blades, calling them "factory seconds". (Don't tell anybody, but I just happen to know that they made those blades specifically for us!)

Speaking of generosity, the quad purchase was to a large extent underwritten by one of our own members. This is the first, brand new, never-been-touched-by-human-hands, boat BARC

RICE ROWING CLUB CONTRACT

"The purpose of the Bay Area Rowing Club of Houston is to promote the sport of rowing in the greater Houston area and help each club member reach the level of rowing proficiency he or she seeks ..."

- Bay Area Rowing Club Membership Handbook

Prior to his departure for Florida, Anil Raj worked tirelessly on a contract between the Rice Rowing Club (RRC) and BARC. Recognizing that you may be inconvenienced or even displaced by members of RRC, Anil strove to structure a synergistic relationship with RRC. His intent was that neither club should subsidize the operations of the other, and that inconvenience to the BARC membership should be minimized. This agreement will be open to re-negotiation at the end of the year. Key components of the agreement are summarized below:

- RRC bought the Tomahawk from BARC
- RRC contracted for the storage of their two 8+s (including the Tomahawk), oars, launch and launch motor
- RRC is renting the Karankawa on a limited basis
- BARC's compensation is calculated in the form of a shell storage fee, institutional membership fee, and usage fee for the Karankawa
- BARC has use of the Rice launch and motor ONLY in emergencies and by special arrangement
- The boathouse combination is to be given ONLY to the designated agents of RRC as prescribed by the Rice Coach (Hannes Hofer)

Traffic at the dock during peak times has doubled due to the agreement. Please observe minimum dock times and record your outings in the log books. Because of potential boat scheduling conflicts, it is essential that regular captains' meetings and boat scheduling take place. Paula Berman has assumed the role of boat scheduler and plans on having the captains' meetings approximately the third Thursday of each month.

Eric Richards will serve as the liaison between BARC and RRC. If you have concerns about how RRC is interacting with our membership, using our equipment, safety or the use of the boathouse, please direct them to Eric or a board member.

change, and I'll have to tell you what the new number is.

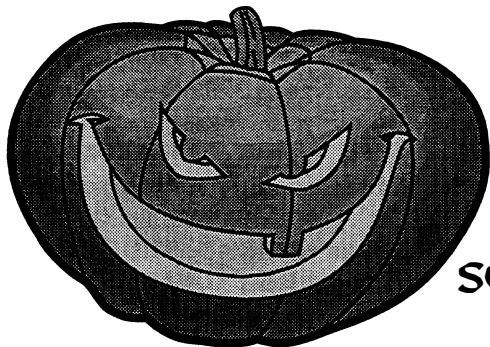

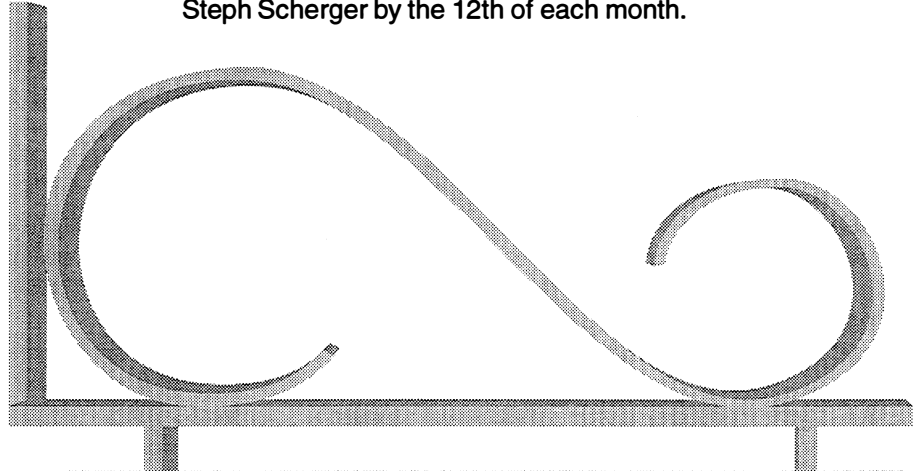
LOG BOOK -- All rows must be logged in the log book. Suggestions to make this easier and more useful are welcome. Ample blank log sheets will be available.
